Abstract

Since its discovery, Pyla-Kokkinokremos has played a pivotal role in examining the crisis years and the collapse of Bronze Age societies at the end of the 13th century BCE. The site's limited chronological occupation and the significant presence of pottery and valuable objects from various Mediterranean regions have prompted scholars to investigate the origins of Pyla's inhabitants, the reasons behind its establishment, and its abrupt abandonment at the dawn of the 12th century BCE.

This paper offers a comprehensive examination of the ceramic evidence from Pyla, emphasizing the multipurpose functional categories and the interplay between local and non-local vessels. It explores how these ceramics can address unresolved questions about Pyla's lifespan, both from an intra-island and broad Mediterranean perspective, shedding light on cross-cultural contacts and interconnections during this transitional period.
